# Supported and Inclusive Learning within OnGuard

The Supported Inclusive Learning features in OnGuard v2 have been mostly discontinued. Here is a list of the strategies that were available in v2.

#### SL TRAINING UNITS - Highlighted Text with Question Number referenced - DISCONTINUED in v3.

We found that teachers were abusing this SL feature and offering it to all of their capable students - simply to make the reading/testing process easier.

Strategies have been implemented by OnGuard Safety Training to assist and support inclusive education. Students experience inclusive education as they access and fully participate in online learning, alongside their similar-aged peers, supported by reasonable adjustments and teaching strategies tailored to meet their individual needs.

#### FEATURE #1

Goto Management > Manage Training Units > View Icon

This will display the Training Units - page by page (SIX SECTIONS) and display the questions for each page.

Using a data projector teachers can present the training unit content to a group of students requiring support.

Conduct a ''chalk and talk" lesson - walk them through the content and the questions – which are targeted to that section.

NOTE: questions no longer SHUFFLE and they are DELIBERATELY presented to match the content - as the student reads down the page.

All the tests and answers in OnGuard v3 are new. They are easily achievable for an average and the most capable student.

The new v3 questions and answers have been created with the less capable students in mind.

We have introduced a TARGETED QUESTIONING strategy. No more question SHUFFLING. The answers do STILL SHUFFLE although.

Each Training Unit CONTENT section has very specific questions related to that section ONLY. The majority of questions are actually copy/paste versions of the content text... see sample below

QUESTION SEQUENCING.

If there are x3 questions in a section, the first question is drawn from the top third of the page, the second question is drawn from the middle of the page and the third question is drawn from the last third of the page.

Where possible, the SOP content has been reduced to SHORT SENTENCES. We have tried to eliminate content previously presented as larger paragraphs. See sample below.

The new question format TYPICALLY has x4 options:

This statement is true and correct.

This statement is false and incorrect.

The answer is not clearly evident in the text.

This is an unnecessary practice.



Most browsers have a 'Search Text and Find in Page' feature. This feature REPLACES the highlighted question/answer function in OnGuard v2.

Key Function on a Windows PC: Control + F

Key Function on an Apple:

Command + F

Simply swipe and highlight the text in the question and then select the key function.

The Test Failure Lock-Out period function that can be edited or turned off. Students are only permitted ONE incorrect answer. Any more and the FAIL the test.

They will be locked out of the training unit for the period of time set in the Configuration section. There are many OPTIONS.

WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU DO NOT TURN THIS FEATURE OFF. If you do, history has shown that your students will abuse the feature.
